



RETIRING PRESIDENTS REPORT

I am pleased to present this, my last president's report.

The 2023 season was a very poor season for snow falls and coverage with most of the fields closing early. Even with the poor season the club had an acceptable financial performance. We have continued with the maintenance programs for both lodges. We are currently looking at updating the kitchen at Hotham. We have also started a trial program of opening the Hotham lodge for summer to assess the potential usage. We have continued to refine the booking system to help our members, our booking office and those on the board who are involved with the system. These items will be covered in more details in the various reports.

As of now, my retirement, I have held the position of president for the last 30 years and being on the board for 31 years.

In that time, I've seen the club grow and mature. There were some controversial decisions that had to be made which led to some interesting discussions. There were also some critical decisions that had been made to keep the club active and viable when circumstances outside our control had to be met.

Over my period, in this position, one of my aims was to achieve profitability for the Mount Hotham Lodge. This has finally happened with an increase in Victorian membership and possibly helped by the new ticketing system which covers fields in NSW and Victoria. I leave the club is in very good financial position which will ensure it can weather unforeseen problems such as COVID.

I have been privileged to have a great group of people support me during my time on the board. All these people are volunteers, and I cannot stress the amount of work and support they have given to this club. I thank them all. A total of 30 board members and 2 booking officers.

At this meeting Matthew Boseley is also retiring from the board. Matthew has been a board member for 9 years and his input and support have been greatly appreciated. I thank him for his much-appreciated help.

I would like to thank all the current board members, and their families, for the work they carried out this year to keep the lodges and club running smoothly. I would also thank all the members, and their friends, who have used our lodges during the year.

2024 TREASURER'S REPORT By Chris Boseley

In 2023, Mt Hotham accounted for 57% of the Club's accommodation income, which reflects the high occupation level in combination with the substantially higher rates we can achieve for Hotham. We achieve these higher rates because Mt Hotham is "on-snow" accommodation, versus Jindabyne which is a 40-minute drive, on a good day to reach the snow.

In 2023 the Club made a modest surplus of \$17,740, which included a non-cash depreciation charge, combined for both lodges, of \$37,628. So, while both lodges are operating well financially, we are generating sufficient surpluses to ensure we can continue to withstand future 'hiccups' & have sufficient reserve funds to invest back into the Lodges.

Of some interest is that we are carrying retained losses of \$132k as at 31/12/2023 which is at the bottom of the equity section of the Balance Sheet. To explain how this figure was derived, for the benefit of the newer members of the club, we have also attached a "Retained Earnings Transaction" report. This report shows in 2016 we already had an accumulated loss of \$113.5K.

This was due to the Jindabyne lodge subsidising the Mt Hotham lodge, which at that time Hotham was only achieving about 30% usage, even in peak season. This low occupation level was exacerbated by the fact that the Club still had a debt of approximately \$140k in 1994 on Hotham and paying interest on that debt. So, the then Treasurer John Kessler, restructured the loans to remove the Hotham's debts at Jindabyne's expense and I have been advised there would be a large component of that interest debt, still included in the \$113.5K accumulated loss.

Moreover, the problems with Hotham's under-utilisation persisted until quite recently when we successfully started sourcing Melbourne memberships. So, now the Hotham bookings are consistently good.

Also, you will notice there was a loss in 2018 and this was due to the application of Depreciation, which allows us to create reserve funds.

Obviously, the 2020/2021 losses were the result of Covid with next to no bookings while the strong 2023 result reflects the rate increase introduced by the board for the 2023 season in combination with a high level of utilisation of both lodges.

2024 Membership Directors report By Robert Philp

While the overall number of members has not changed, in line with the Articles of Association, there have been some sales of membership at both lodges over the past 12 months.

We have a total of 169 lodge members, broken up as follows:

A (Jindabyne) 82

B (Both) 30

C (Hotham) 57

In addition, we have 17 Ordinary members, ostensibly waiting on available memberships before becoming full lodge members.

If you are thinking of selling your membership, there is most likely someone waiting to buy it, so let the Membership Director know so he can put you in touch with a potential buyer.

Because of tax implications the Club cannot handle the sale, but we can put together potential buyers and sellers.

2024 Booking Officer Report By Karen Johnson

In the second year our new booking program club members seem to have found it user friendly and there have been very few problems. The opening of first round bookings for the ski season was a much easier process than in the past 5 years.

The program has a limited capacity to include the many rules of our club, for example it cannot change a non-member price where the non-member is staying in a room with members. However, these quirks are easily corrected prior to the booking being approved as I check for other rule compliance and correct the fees charged. The feedback I receive anecdotally is generally good. I am always happy to assist where members have problems with the booking process.

As usual the Jindabyne Lodge has been well used over Summer by our members and by the bushwalking club for their annual meetup in the mountains.

In its first year for Summer bookings the Hotham lodge has had very little use but this may grow in the years to come.

 - Lights and power points were Installed to charge e-bikes for free.
- The ground floor storeroom was cleaned first time in decades.
- Lockers were removed and the storeroom cleared. New industrial shelving was installed for storage of supplies and for easy access.






Thredbo
